## Today is final piece to the 1000 Cranes Project! RECAP

- 1. Our Summer 2022 student ambassador **Charlotte Auh** came up with the project initiative to make a 1000 Cranes and make the wish "We wish for AAPIRC and the entire AAPI community continues to thrive and be recognized in the face of prejudice and unjustified hate."
- 2. During Fall 2022 semester, NM Japanese American Citizen League visited AAPIRC and educated us about Sadako with a kickoff event.
- 3. The UNM community including Japanese Language and Culture Club, Language Learning Center, AAPIRC attendees, and many others folded 1000 Cranes.
- 4. On Feb 21st of this semester, we honored The Day of Remembrance (DOR, Japanese: 追憶の日,[1] Tsuioku no Hi) as the day of observance for the incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II. On February 19, 1942 President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed the Executive Order 9066 requiring internment of all Americans of Japanese ancestry. We string up 25 strings of 40 cranes to total 1000.
- 5. Today, Tuesday March 28th, we will look at the completed art piece, make our collective wish, learn more about this history and write haikus.

Intro to Asian American Studies course is back for Fall 2023!



This course introduces students to historical formations and contemporary experiences of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the United States and beyond. Deploying a transdisciplinary approach, we look at and develop an in-depth understanding of Asian American Studies as a complex and dynamic field of critical histories and theoretical interventions.

Who is Asian American? Who is excluded from the category? How and why have historical formations of Asian American been shifting over time? Who and what determines how this shifting takes place?

This course, which draws upon transdisciplinary scholarships that represent differences among Asian American and Pacific Islander experiences, identities, and places/spaces, is comprehensive and extensive.
