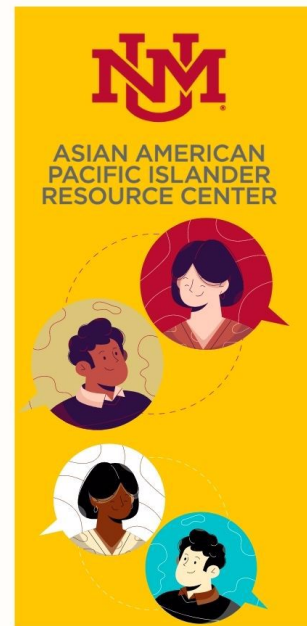

Lunar New Year: Recap



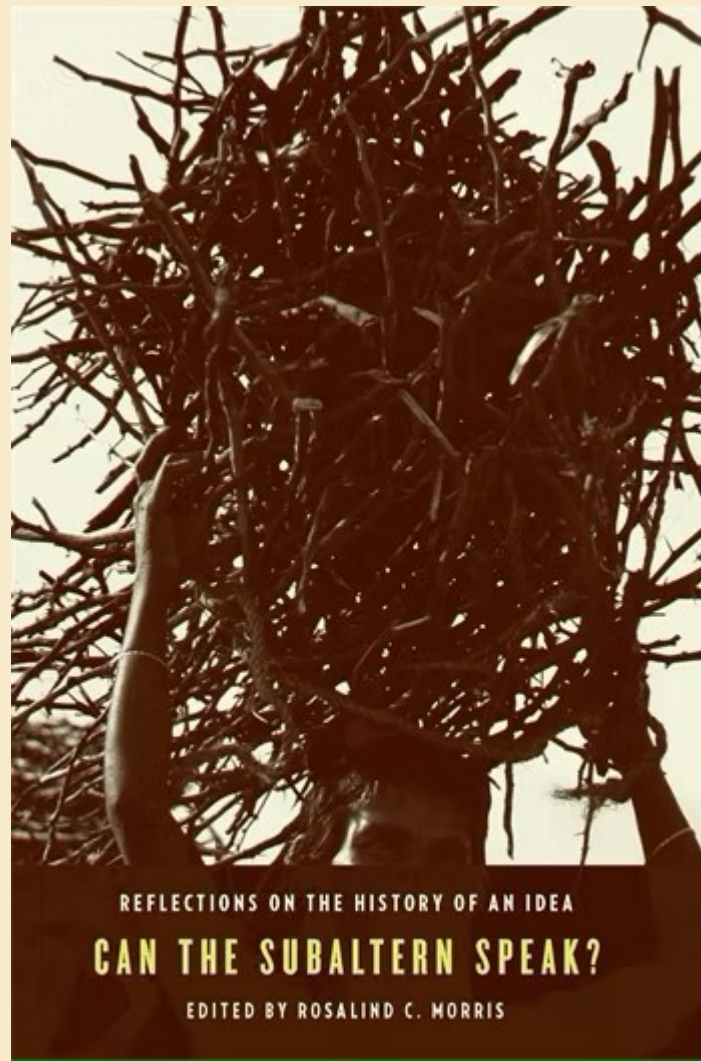

Postcolonialism: A Reading Group

Fridays 1-3pm at AAPIRC



The second meeting of Spring 2023's Postcolonialism Reading Group will be a discussion session on Gayatri Spivak's infamous 1988 essay "Can the Subaltern Speak?", on **Friday, February 3, from 1-3pm, at AAPIRC.**

Spivak's essay touches on a range of issues, from **global capitalism, colonialism, patriarchy, subjectivity, and epistemology**. In particular, she focuses on the case of the abolition of widow sacrifice by the British colonial administrators of the Indian subcontinent, raising questions regarding the "freedom" and "voice" of the subaltern woman in this context. Along the way, she uses Marx and Derrida to critique Foucault and Deleuze, advocating for a return to theories of ideology.

As one of the landmark postcolonialist texts, the goal of this discussion session will be to unpack the text together, to render it accessible to us, and to draw critical implications.

Eligible applicants are college rising juniors through graduating seniors who are full-time students in any academic discipline and interested in the field of education. Underrepresented minority groups are strongly encouraged to apply.

- APPLICANTS MUST:**
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident;
 - Have a minimum 3.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale);
 - Have completed 3 or more credit hours of coursework in a social science (e.g. sociology, psychology, political science);
 - Have written a literature review or research paper and be interested in pursuing doctoral studies; and
 - Submit a completed application.

- BENEFITS**
- Develop research skills during an eight-week (58 days) summer research institute, followed by a year-long faculty mentor experience.
 - Prepare for the GRE and work on applications to doctoral programs.
