

November is also Native American Heritage Month! Visit aiss.unm.edu for more information and campus resources.



support, permitting assistance, and business advising. We are the first and only nonprofit in New Mexico specifically founded to serve API owned businesses.

PURPOSE: To assess community needs, conduct outreach/advocacy and increase ABC visibility in the API business community. The position has a flexible time frame of employment and must be available for operational meetings. The Community Outreach Assistant pay rate is between \$15 to \$17/hr with a minimum of 20 hours per week. The coordinator position has a flexible time frame of employment and must be available for operational meetings.

WORK ASSIGNMENTS INCLUDE:

- Meet with, survey, present to the Asian business community members to gauge culturally relevant and pressing needs in the community
- Serve as a liaison between the Asian business community, ABC and community partners
- Coordinate outreach, advocacy, and education activities for relevant issues in the Asian business community
- Represent ABC at community events and assist with outreach
- Provide leadership in facilitating community events relevant to the needs and interests of API business owners
- Schedule, organize and oversee the planning and implementation of outreach strategies
- Prepare, manage, and disseminate informational materials to future clients, Asian business owners, and the New Mexico greater community
- Conduct and collect research to establish key demographic and informational data on the makeup of

the Asian business community in New Mexico, its history, and its needs

- Help maintain social media accounts
- Develop additional marketing opportunities for the organization
