





We provide API–owned businesses with direct business support such as financial consulting, language support, permitting assistance, and business advising. We are the first and only nonprofit in New Mexico specifically founded to serve API owned businesses.

PURPOSE: To assess community needs, conduct outreach/advocacy and increase ABC visibility in the API business community. The position has a flexible time frame of employment and must be available for operational meetings. The Community Outreach Assistant pay rate is between \$15 to \$17/hr with a minimum of 20 hours per week. The coordinator position has a flexible time frame of employment and must be available for operational meetings.

WORK ASSIGNMENTS INCLUDE:


- Meet with, survey, present to the Asian business community members to gauge culturally relevant and pressing needs in the community

- Conduct and collect research to establish key demographic and informational data on the makeup of the Asian business community in New Mexico, its history, and its needs
- Help maintain social media accounts
- Develop additional marketing opportunities for the organization
